on Clapham Common

The Colourscape Music Festival has appeared annually on Clapham Common since 1989 the only contemporary music festival to take place actually inside a sculpture. **Composers Lawrence Casserley and** Simon Desorgher originally founded their south London music festival in Nettlefold Hall. When they encountered Colourscape they made the decision to move the whole contemporary music festival into this amazing new space.

Colourscape is a very large labyrinth of colour and light - a sculpture of pure colour that the public actually go inside. Everyone puts on a coloured cape to become part of the colour experience and enters into a new world where one can freely explore the potentials of light, colour and space.

But as if that wasn't enough..... there is also music, dance and theatre taking place inside! This is a full nine-day festival where the "venue" is our newest walkin structure of about 70 interlinked chambers. Explore for a while and you discover long views of intense colour and light. Move forwards and another view opens up - and another - and another. Musicians and dancers are found anywhere in this extraordinary space leading the public on a journey of colour, music and space.

This will give you the best light and colour qualities from the sun in the middle of the day.

Stevie Wishart (Hurdy-Gurdy) and Maureen Wolloshin (oboes and gliss-anglais) perform echoes of medieval, modern, and environmental sounds weaving together. Otters are an endangered species whose sounds and friendship inspire the improvisations they produce.



PLUS Balladeste

Preetha Narayanan (cello) and Tara Franks (violin) perform their original music in their own unique style of "Indo-Barogue" meets alt-folk minimalism. Their music draws on influences of medieval composer Hildegard of Bingen, minimalist Arvo Pärt and harmonies of Purcell to create an eclectic palette.

The two duos will rotate throughout the day so that you should experience both during your 40 minute visit.

Ansuman Biswas, Sylvia Hallett, Michael Ormiston and Beibei Wang play natural sounds and instruments; Lawrence Casserley and David Stevens transform the natural sounds with computers; creative dancers Eileih Muir and Conn Williams explore the whole space of Colourscape actively involving the public in the action.

We present new pieces for Colourscape by three composers. These were runners-up in our Commission award.

Joe Bates performs on his Hyasynth. His music is built from drifting melodies and strange chords, structured by the rhetorics of classical counterpoint and electronic dance music.... there is often something ceremonial about this music that emerges from the interplay of the familiar and the strange.

Duncan Chapman - Lullaby: Sonic Cradle brings the hue of

South Indian classical vocal melodies mixed with gentle viola and soundscapes. Touring internationally since 2015: Carnatic vocals, Duncan Chapman on electronics/field recordings and Neil Valentine on electric viola gently soothe and lull listeners into a relaxed state.

Aris Daryono performs

"Penjaga Malam" (Guardian of Night) - an immersive sound installation blending gamelan, Western classical, and popular culture influences. The project combines loops and live gamelan performances to explore the

rich soundscape of Javanese music, drawing inspiration from his childhood experiences in a rural village in Solo-Central Java, Indonesia.

The three events will alternate throughout the afternoon. You should be able to experience a good sample during your 40 minute visit.

11.30am to 3.30pm Suns by Lara Agar (our 2024 Eye Music Rawsthorn commission)

Composer Lara Agar presents an afternoon of sonorous, immersive music with a new work for cello quartet, soprano and mezzo soprano. You can move freely around Colourscape to experience subtle differences in sonority, harmony and timbre.

This piece is called Suns, inspired by the way the light moves over the Colourscape and changes the chambers, and in a nod to the mirror between the dream-like worlds imagined by our ancestors and modern day imagination of those incredible clusters of suns and nebulae in outer space. It will be a modular and durational work in which two lost singers wander through the colour chambers. Motion sensors will trigger fragments of the songs which the audience can interact with, evoking dreams and memories. Performed by Rosalie Warner (mezzo soprano); Patricia Auchterlonie (soprano) and cello guartet.

The Colourscape sculpture presented at our 2024 festival creates a unique environment linking music, colour and space.

The Colourscape sculpture presented at our 2024 festival creates a unique environment linking music, colour and space. Highly coloured chambers are linked by elliptical openings to form a breathtaking experience of the potentials of colour and space illuminated by natural daylight. The public wear cloaks of primary colours that change in hue as they move through the intensely coloured chambers

Whilst wandering through interconnected chambers, you will experience the intensity and subtlety of colour. We use only translucent red, blue, green, yellow and opague grey but you will see mixtures of colour that you may not be able to name.

The main Colourscape that we present on Clapham Common is called "Festival Two" and is our second largest structure with about 70 chambers. It incorporates a large silver space with high columns and domed ceiling. This space forms the chamber for the larger ensembles and performances.

Your ticket admits you to Colourscape for up to 40 minutes

From the reactions of many thousands of visitors, it is obvious that people have strong feelings about colour. Some people describe red as a physical presence; others hesitate to step into it. Some people find green relaxing, others find it disturbing. Find out how you respond when you come to Colourscape. Many visitors are moved to express their experience in poetic terms:.....

"I felt I could almost breathe the colours."

"The blues and soft grevs went on forever. I could feel myself expanding with the red and growing calmer with the greens and blues. The people were dancers on a stage like a surreal abstract ballet. The music was excellent and much appreciated."

Please do be aware of other people's enjoyment of the music and the space – particularly keeping any noise to a minimum in the main music listening areas and please avoid obstructing other people's view when making videos or photos.

Colourscapes have been created by artists Peter Jones and Lynne Dickens and constructed with help from artist Becky Knight, Our "Festival One" (1994), "Festival Two" and "Moonorooni" Colourscapes have been commissioned by Eye Music Trust with funding from the National Lottery, Foundation for Sport and the Arts, Arts Council and City Bridge Trust.

- We employ a specially-designed wind-break system that reduces the power of any wind by 65% and can be seen running around the whole structure.
- Colourscape has been tested by independent safety engineers and passed as meeting high standards of anchoring and stewarding.
